









colourful semantics	Sentence building and sentence structure using colour coded visuals.	
who?	The subject/noun in the sentence	
what doing?	The verb in the sentence

<p>where?</p>	<p>The preposition in the sentence.</p>	
<p>Sentence</p>	<p>A set of words that express something in the form of a question or state*ment etc.; This sentence has seven words in it.</p>	
<p>capital letter</p>	<p>One of the large alphabetic characters used as the first letter in writing or printing proper names.</p>	
<p>lower case letter</p>	<p>Smaller alphabetic character. One of the symbols that you put together to make up a word; The letter S.</p>	<p>abc</p>
<p>word building</p>	<p>Putting the sounds together to make up a word.</p>	
<p>fairy-tale</p>	<p>a story about fairies; told to amuse children</p>	
<p>adjective</p>	<p>An adjective describes a noun; The red shoes; 'red' is the adjective.</p>	




number	One of the symbols used in mathematics and counting (1, 2, etc.), or the word that corresponds to it; The number two; the number 2.	123
one	The number 1, which comes just before 2; One candle on the cake.	1 
two	The number 2, which sits between 1 and 3; We have two cars.	2 
three	The number 3, which sits between 2 and 4; He has three dogs.	3 
four	The number 4, which sits between 3 and 5; There were four women at the party.	4 
five	The number 5, which sits between 4 and 6; I have five dresses.	5 
six	The number 6, which sits between 5 and 7; The hen laid six eggs.	6 






seven	The number 7, which sits between 6 and 8; She is seven years old.	
eight	The number that comes between seven and nine (8); There were eight people at the meeting.	
nine	The number 9, which sits between 8 and 10; She was pregnant for nine months.

zero	The number 0, meaning 'nothing'; I have zero money.





vegetables	A plant or part of a plant that can be eaten	
woodland	land that is covered with trees and shrubs	
beach	The part of land beside the sea that is made of sand or small stones; Let's take a walk along the beach.	
town	A place with streets and houses that is smaller than a city but larger than a village; She grew up in a town.	
meadow	a field where grass or alfalfa are grown to be made into hay	
field	A place where farmers can grow crops or keep animals; The cows lay in the field.	
map	A drawing of a part of the earth's surface as seen from above; We used a map to find our way through the town.	



<p>journey</p>	<p>The act of travelling; The journey took us three hours.</p>	
<p>bridge</p>	<p>A structure built over a road or river etc. that allows vehicles and people to cross over it; There is a bridge over this road.</p>	
<p>materials</p>	<p>A thing needed for a particular activity; She will need writing materials for school.</p>	
<p>strong</p>	<p>Having much physical power; She is very strong for her size.</p>	
<p>weak</p>	<p>Likely to break because unable to carry much weight; The shelf is too weak to hold all the books.</p>	
<p>flexible</p>	<p>Able to bend without breaking; The gymnast was very flexible.</p>





Key word	Definition	Visual
printing	A reproduction by applying ink or paint to paper.	
pattern	Shapes and colours etc. put together in a regular way; A pattern on her shirt.	
construction	the act of constructing something; "during the construction we had to take a detour"; "his hobby was the building of boats"	
sculpture	A work of art made by shaping a piece of wood or stone etc.; An ice sculpture.	
Collage	a paste-up made by sticking together pieces of paper or photographs to form an artistic image	

Personal, social, emotional development: Zones of Regulation

Key word	Definition	Visual
Blue zone	The Blue Zone is used to describe low states of alertness , such as when one feels sad, tired, sick, or bored.	 <p>BLUE ZONE</p>
Green zone	The Green Zone is used to describe a calm state of alertness . A person may be described as happy, focused, content, or ready to learn when in the Green Zone. Being in the Green Zone will help students be successful in the classroom.	 <p>GREEN ZONE</p>
Yellow zone	The Yellow Zone is also used to describe a heightened state of alertness and elevated emotions ; however, one has some control when they are in the Yellow Zone. A person may be experiencing stress, frustration, anxiety, excitement, silliness, the wiggles, or nervousness when in the Yellow Zone.	 <p>YELLOW ZONE</p>
Red zone	The Red Zone is used to describe extremely heightened states of alertness and intense emotions . A person may be elated or experiencing anger, rage, explosive behaviour, devastation, or	 <p>RED ZONE</p>





	terror when in the Red Zone.	
team work	The combined action of a group, especially when effective and efficient.	
toolbox	Use the strategies in this toolbox to help younger learners understand their feelings and self-regulate.
