





<p>Viking</p>	<p>A group of people from Scandinavia. They sailed to and then attacked and lived in different countries in the 8th-11th Century.</p>	
<p>Scandinavia</p>	<p>The name given to the collection of countries: Denmark, Norway and Sweden.</p>	
<p>Farmer</p>	<p>Someone who grows plants and raises animals for human use.</p>	
<p>Trader</p>	<p>A person who buys, sells or exchange goods or services between people, firms, or countries.</p>	
<p>Explorer</p>	<p>A person who explores an area that is not known.</p>	
<p>Invasion</p>	<p>Using an army to take over another country.</p>	





<p>Longhouse</p>	<p>A Viking home. A long and narrow building, made from wood, stone or turf and was usually just one big room without any inside walls.</p>	 <p>Viking Longhouses</p>
<p>Monastery</p>	<p>A building where a religious community (usually monks) lives.</p>	
<p>Alfred The Great</p>	<p>Alfred the Great - Anglo Saxon who was King of Wessex. He fought against the Vikings.</p>	
<p>Danelaw</p>	<p>The name given to lands in Britain occupied by the Vikings.</p>	
<p>Long ships</p>	<p>A warship. The narrow boat used by Vikings to raid along coasts.</p>	 <p>VIKING LONGSHIP</p>
<p>Raids</p>	<p>An armed/ military attack, especially a quick surprise attack</p>	

Dragonships	Large longships that had carved heads of dragons.	
Paganism	Pagan: A person who believes in/worships many different gods or goddesses or the earth or nature, especially one that existed before the main world religions, such as Christianity, Judaism, or Islam. A person whose religion is paganism.	
Runes	The Viking system of writing that was made up of lines or letters.	
Berserkers	Warriors that went to war wearing wolf or bear skins. They were out of control and charged fearlessly.	








Key word	Definition	Visual


