

Anther	A part of the flower that contains the pollen,	 An illustration showing a stamen with a long filament and a two-lobed anther. Yellow pollen grains are shown floating around the anther.
filament	A thin fibre found in a living thing.	 A cross-section diagram of a flower showing the internal parts. The filament is the long, thin stalk that supports the anther.
Stamen	The male part of a flower.	 A cross-section diagram of a flower showing the stamen, which consists of the anther and the filament.
Stigma	The female part of a flower.	 A cross-section diagram of a flower showing the stigma, which is the upper part of the female reproductive organ.
leaf	The green flat part of a plant.	 A simple illustration of a single green leaf with a central vein and a pointed tip.
root	The parts of a flower which go underground and gather water for the rest of the plant.	 An illustration of a small green plant with several roots extending into the soil underground.
xylem	The part of the flower which dissolves minerals which were gathered in roots.	 A detailed cross-section diagram of a stem showing the vascular tissues. The xylem is the inner tissue responsible for water transport.
stem	The main green part which runs along the middle of the plant.	 An illustration of a green stem with a single white flower at the top.
fruit	An edible food which grows on plants.	 An illustration showing a variety of fruits: a pear, an apple, and a banana.
blossom	A flower which grows on a bush and tree.	 An illustration of a woody branch with several small purple flowers (blossoms) and green leaves.






