

Termly Curriculum overview

Class: Comets

Term: Spring 2

Maths- Subtraction and mass

Students will begin by looking at parts and wholes as a concept and then make parts from whole numbers. From this, children will begin to learn how to write basic subtraction sentences.

Students will also learn about mass, capacity and volume and will learn the units of measurement associated with them and how to measure liquids and solids.

English

Students will read a variety of fairy tales and create their own fairy tale story whilst developing their skills of planning and developing ideas of their own.

Understanding of the World

This term, Comets class will utilise their observational skills in order to identify changes that occur in Spring in the natural world. Students will also look at the parts of a flower.

RE

This term Comets will be exploring different religious stories and their meanings. By the end of this topic, they will be know what a 'morals' is and know various stories from different religions that help give messages about values and their importance.

Music

Students will create and listen to different tuned instruments and will learn to identify pitch and timbre.

DT.

Children will learn about kitchen safety, and where food comes from. They will learn about different types of healthy breakfasts and what makes food healthy. They will start to develop cooking skills by helping to make a healthy breakfasts.

PE- Basketball

This term the children will focussing on their coordination and ball skills. They will practice, throwing, catching, bouncing, dribbling and throwing accuracy to hit a target. They will explore these skills in a range of games and activities.

ART Drawing Skills

This term will focus on continuing to develop fine motor skills. Children will drawing skills and learn about the different mark making techniques, colour, portraits, shadow and tone.

PSHE

This half term, Comets will be exploring the NSPCC's 'speak out, stay safe' safeguarding programme. They will be learning about different situations including: Physical and verbal and sexual abuse, neglect and bullying all within age appropriate language and context.

Computing

Comets will be learning how to type their names using a keyboard and practise making changes to their work. They will explore the toolbar . Children will also compare writing digitally with writing using a pencil and talk about the differences between them.
