




Tropical Rainforest	A tropical rainforest is a hot, wet place with lots of trees and animals.	






Communication	Talking and working with others to improve teamwork and performance.	





Symmetry	Symmetry in art is the formal balance achieved when elements—shapes, colors, or patterns—are arranged to mirror creating harmony, order, and stability	




Watercolour	Watercolor is a painting method using pigments suspended in a water-based, transparent medium applied to paper.	
Symbolism	An artistic movement in the late 19th century that tried to express abstract or mystical ideas through the symbolic use of images.	
Observation	It is the practice of creating art by directly observing subjects from real life, such as still lifes, landscapes, or figures.	
Patterns	A way in which things are arranged or occur regularly.





Translucent	Allowing light to pass through diffusely.	







Sprite	A sprite is a character or object in Scratch that can be programmed to perform actions.	




