













Key word	Definition	Visual
Biography	A book that is written about someone's life by another person.	
Fact	A statement or assertion of verified information about something that is the case or has happened.	
Infer	Guess correctly; conclude by reasoning.	
1,2,3rd person narrative	<p>The first person is the person speaking (I, we)</p> <p>The third person is the person or thing spoken about (she, he, they)</p> <p>The second person is the person spoken to (you).</p>	
Formal	A structured, objective style used in professional and academic contexts, characterized by full sentences and proper grammar.	
Adjectives	Describes a noun. A word that expresses an attribute of something. The shoes are red.	
Structure	A systematic, modular approach to creating content by breaking information into small, focused, and labeled units.	









Key word	Definition	Visual

Survivor	A person who continues to live or exist after an event.	




Key word	Definition	Visual



Newspaper	A factual piece of writing published in print or online to inform readers about current events, trends, or specific topics.	
Biography	A written account of someone's life, written by someone else.	
Kenning	A figurative, two-word phrase used in Old Norse and Old English poetry to replace a common noun, acting as a riddle-like metaphor.	
Beowulf	Old English epic poem, composed between 700 and 1025 AD, and considered the highest achievement of early English literature. It describes the Geatish hero Beowulf, who battles monsters	
Anglo-Saxon	the Germanic-speaking peoples (Angles, Saxons, Jutes) who inhabited England from roughly AD 450 to 1066, forming the cultural foundation of early England	
Norse	Norse refers to the people, language, and culture of medieval Scandinavia.	
Compare	to examine two or more things, people, or ideas to identify their similarities and differences	
Infer	to reach a conclusion or form an opinion based on evidence, clues, or reasoning.	



Interpret	To explain what something means in your own words.	
Evidence	Proof that supports your ideas or answers, like a quote from a book or a fact.	






Chronology	The order of events in time.	





<p>Compare</p>	<p>To show how two or more things are the same.</p>	
<p>Contrast</p>	<p>To show how two or more things are different.</p>	
<p>Details</p>	<p>The small pieces of information that give more meaning to a story or idea.</p>	

Balanced argument	A piece of writing or speech that gives both sides of an issue, showing reasons for and against.	
Evidence	Proof that supports your ideas or answers, like a quote from a book or a fact.

Key word	Definition	Visual
point	Different meanings: Is a sharp or tapered end (end of a pencil, tip of a finger) or can be defined as a specific idea or a precise dimension in a width.	
information	A collection of data that informs and educates.	

<p>idea</p>	<p>An idea is a thought, plan, conception, or mental image formed in the mind, representing a result of mental activity.</p>	
<p>opinion</p>	<p>An opinion is a personal judgment on someone or something, which is based on feelings and thoughts rather than objective facts.</p>	
<p>signs</p>	<p>A sign is an object, gesture or event that communicates meaning, conveys information, or indicates the presence of something else.</p>	
<p>symbols</p>	<p>A symbol is a mark, sign, object, or character that represents, stands for, or suggests something else.</p>	
<p>contents page</p>	<p>A contents page is a list found in the front matter of a book, document, or publication that outlines chapters or sections in chronological order with their page numbers.</p>	

bullet points	<p>a small symbol, often a black circle, used in text to show each new part of a list.</p>	
heading	<p>A heading is a title or subtitle placed at the top of a page, section, or paragraph to define information in a text.</p>	
subheading	<p>A sub-heading is a mini-headline given to a section or paragraph within a main piece of writing.</p>	
column	<p>Two definitions : one of the straight sections from top to bottom into which text on a page or screen is divided. Or, a column is a vertical structure that is supported by a base.</p>	
paragraph	<p>A paragraph is a distinct section of writing, consisting of one or more sentences, that deals with one idea or topic at a time.</p>
